New Year's Greetings from Mayor Tanabe



Happy New Year! I, along with all the residents of Shizuoka City, have spent the last year facing down Covid-19. Especially last summer, at the height of the so-called 5th wave, when our prefecture went into a state of emergency, our days were filled with uncertainty as to when things would

get back to normal. But the fact that we were able to overcome these difficulties is down to the perseverance and self-restraint that you all have shown in the face of this long pandemic, as well as that almost 80 percent of our City has been vaccinated. You have my heartfelt thanks for being so highly conscious with regards to preventing the spread of the virus.

This last year was a year of joy as well, with the Tokyo 2020 Olympic and Paralympic Games being held. The performance of the Japanese athletes, including those from our own city, brought us great hope at a time when we were prone to despair. And, as the fight against Covid-19 continues into the New Year, I will be taking that Olympic and Paralympic passion with me, keeping vigilant against the spread of the virus, and giving my all at the helm of our city government.

From point of the "2 Lives" principle (protecting life (*inochi*) and restoring our daily lives (*kurashi*)), the first step is to move forward smoothly with the Covid-19 booster shots. This will be another year in the final stages of the "3rd General Plan of Shizuoka City", our 8-year plan to realize the community development goal, "Shizuoka, a City of World Standards". One of the "5 Main Frameworks" of this plan is "Creating a Base of Historical Culture". In this regard, we are moving forward with the construction of the Shizuoka City Museum of History, ahead of its grand-opening in January 2023. This is just one example of the steady efforts we are making in bridging into the next plan.

The battle with Covid-19 is a long one. We may yet be visited by another wave. Ensuring the booster shots are completed as soon as possible, stimulating the economy, revitalizing tourism – we will do our utmost in advancing sustainable community development that befits the "With-Covid Era".

From the bottom of my heart, I pray for your heath and prosperity, as well as for the end of the Covid-19 pandemic. Happy New Year!

Booster (3rd) Vaccination Information

Approximately 540,000 people in Shizuoka City have received 2 shots of the vaccine. Persons for whom 8 months have passed since receiving the 2nd shot are candidates for the booster (3rd) shot. We will aim to send everyone their 3rd vaccination ticket once about 7 months has passed since receiving the 2nd shot. Persons who moved into the city after receiving their 2nd shot, etc. will need to apply. We will also continue to make vaccination available to those who have newly become candidates for the vaccine, as well as others who have yet to receive their 1st and/or 2nd shots. We will also subsidize part of the taxi fare of persons 65 and older (born up until 1 April 1958) getting their 3rd shots. Details on how to use this service will be enclosed with your 3rd vaccination ticket.

Looking for Trainees for FY2022

We are looking for trainees who want to study agriculture (focusing mainly on outdoor vegetables) over the course of a year. The training will take place on agricultural training land where farming can be experienced on a practical scale. You



will train in cultivation techniques with a farmer, learn about the planning required to start a career in agriculture, the sales of agricultural produce, and more. Through this we aim to equip you with the knowledge required to manage an agricultural business.

We are also renting out part of this training land (for growing vegetables only; in the event of many applicants priority will be given to those who wish to take part in the agricultural training).

Agricultural equipment and irrigation facilities are available to both trainees and people renting the land.

Agricultural Training

When: April 2022 to March 2023

Who: Individuals aged 63 or younger who want to acquire the necessary knowledge and skills, and start farming in Shizuoka City; Corporations interested in entering the agricultural industry **Cost:** ¥100,000 for the year. (1 plot)

Renting Land

When: April 2022 to March 2023

Who: Persons or corporations working as farmers in Shizuoka City, or who have agricultural experience and know how to use the land properly.

Cost: ¥20,000 for the year (1 plot)

Applications: Post your application form to the Agricultural Policy Division or bring it in person. The deadline is 4 March 2022 (Friday). There will be a selection process.
