Student Financial Aid System

This is a financial aid system available to parents facing financial difficulties in sending their children to public elementary or junior high school. The aid covers part of the costs related to school supplies, school lunches, etc.

Special Needs Education Financial Aid

Financial aid is available to reduce the financial burden on parents with children in special needs classes, etc. at municipal elementary or junior high schools. This aid covers part of the costs of things like school supplies (notebooks, stationery, schoolbags, uniforms, indoor and outdoor school shoes, hats, etc.) and school lunches. When purchasing supplies, please keep the receipts as they are necessary when receiving the aid.

*Things such as school bags and uniforms bought for new first year students before entering school may also be eligible for aid so please make sure to keep the receipts.

Trial Run of Shizuoka MaaS Rideshare Taxi

From daily shopping, to appointments at the clinic, use "ride sharing" to get around affordably. This is a new service that combines the convenience of a taxi (picking you up wherever you want), with the affordability of a bus (splitting costs between multiple passengers).

- You will need to draw up your own tax return at the venue.

Residence tax for 2023 is based on your income for 2022. *Submission not required by those who submitted a final tax return for income tax.

This festival will be held in Okitsu, birthplace of the sweet bean paste industry, to coincide with the blooming of the local usu-kanzakura cherry blossoms. 

The 4 R's in Our Daily Lives

Shizuoka is carrying out its own "Mottainai" initiatives! In order to move from a mass production, mass consumption, and mass disposal society to a recycling-orientated society, the City of Shizuoka is carrying out a wide range of initiatives to create a city that supplies just the right amount goods and services to those who need them, when they need them. The catch phrase for these initiatives is "Mottainai", and to make them a success we need your help with upholding the 4 R's. Let's all start doing what we can.

Refuse

E.g. Refusing unnecessary plastic bags and disposable cutlery when shopping, and bringing reusable bags and cutlery. Plastic bag fees began in July 2020, but the city has been working with local businesses to reduce plastic bags since signing an agreement in 2008.



Reduce

E.g. Buying refillable or unpackaged goods, and carrying a reusable cup with you. Some stores offer discounts when you bring your own cup or flask.

The city registers local businesses working to reduce plastic waste as Plastic Waste Reduction Partner Stores.

E.g. Participating in food drives, where you donate unused food products to food banks who will deliver it to people who need it.

Recycle

The city signed an agreement with 7-11 Japan in October 2021, and there are now PET bottle recycling machines at 80 7-11

stores in the city (as of Jan 2023). This is part of a "bottle to bottle" initiative, turning used PET bottles into new PET bottles.
